Union Breaks Ground on New Headquarters

Monday, May 12th, marked a significant milestone in Local 675's history. Union leaders and community partners gathered for the inaugural Groundbreaking Ceremony for the new location of the Plumbers and Fitters Local 675 Union Building in Aiea.

Business Manager **Val Ceria** began with opening remarks, followed by PAMCAH Management Trustee **Kent Matsuzaki**. Both of whom expressed their optimism for the 2.5-acre property and what it means for our Union. The Union Office and Trust Fund Administration Office have been located in downtown Honolulu on Bethel Street for decades, with the Local 675 Training Facilities currently situated in Iwilei and Pearl City. The new location will bring together the Union Office, Trust Fund Administration Office, and a state-of-the-art Training Center under one roof, making it a "One-Stop-Shop" for Union members.

The Union acquired a fee simple property located on Moanalua Loop. **Unlimited Construction** was selected as the General Contractor for the project. The existing building on the property will be renovated for our Union Offices and Training Center. Renovations of the Training Center will be initiated first and is projected to be completed by mid-2026.

Business Manager's Message | Valentino B. Ceria

Aloha Members,

In early April, I attended the annual NABTU (North American Building Trades Unions) Legislative Conference in Washington, D.C. NABTU President **Sean McGarvey**, said it would be a challenging year for Labor Unions. President **Donald Trump** issued an executive order (EO) that affects an EO signed by former President **Joe Biden**, which encouraged federal agencies to prioritize projects involving Project Labor Agreements (PLAs) and supported other pro-labor agreements. The shift in minimizing the use of PLAs on federal construction projects moving forward signals a less favorable environment for Unions under the Trump Administration.

Now, more than ever, it is of utmost importance that we stay informed and engaged in our local legislative processes to ensure we uphold the values and protect the rights of our workers. And we have been doing just that: during the 2025 Hawai'i legislative session, Local 675 has emerged as one of the most active advocacy groups. We advocated on almost 200 proposals this session to defend our priorities in securing work projects and protecting procurement. Our presence covered energy, infrastructure, labor protections, and more. We continue to stay active with Union-aligned legislation, which will help us fortify our workforce development goals.

The Groundbreaking Ceremony for the new Union Building in Aiea was held on Monday, May 12th. **Kahu Shon Kihewa** graciously led the ceremony and did a walk-through blessing of the property. While the building permit is still under review by the Department of Planning and Permitting, we received approval for the Special Assignment Inspection (SAI), which allowed our General Contractor, Unlimited Construction, to begin the demolition work. Now that the demolition work is nearly complete, the construction of the columns for the new mezzanine deck is underway.

Regarding Training news, the Pipeline to the Plumbers Union program, designed for High School students as a

direct pathway into the Union, is expanding its efforts to the neighbor islands. The week-long training program was held for the first time on Maui in June during the high school's summer break. (Page 5)

In May, the Union Officers and I joined the Retirees Club for their quarterly meeting. Business Agents shared updates from their respective islands, informing the retirees of local developments. Trust Fund Administrator **Erinn Liu** also attended and provided valuable benefit information and updates. (Page 11)

Fiscal Year End 2024 Annuity Statements were sent out to members in May. Trust Fund Administrator, **Erinn Liu**, provides insight into how you can grow your Annuity interest and investment earnings to maximize your retirement savings. Please also review the update on the Dependent Verification Process, which is currently in progress, to ensure your eligible dependents receive Health and Welfare benefits. (Page 3)

Health and Welfare Updates

Dependent Verification Process Underway

The PAMCAH-UA Local 675 Health and Welfare Plan ("the Plan") provides some of the most comprehensive benefits in the construction industry. To protect the integrity of the Plan and ensure that only eligible dependents are covered, a **Dependent Eligibility Verification** will take place over the next several weeks.

Part D Advisors (PDA) has been contracted to conduct this process. You will receive a verification form in the mail from the PDA Verification Team, along with instructions and a list of required legal documents.

We recommend that you begin assembling your documentation now to help ensure you meet the verification deadline. Examples of required documents may include:

- Marriage certificate or the first page of your most recent income tax return
- Birth certificates for your children
- Court documents for adopted children or children of divorce
- Medical proof of incapacitation for dependents covered due to total disability

Participation in this verification is mandatory. If the PDA

Verification Team does not receive your completed form and supporting documents by the deadline listed on the form, **coverage for your dependents will be terminated.**

Verifying dependent eligibility helps maintain the strength of our Plan and manage healthcare costs for all members. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Annuity Update

The PAMCAH-UA Local 675 Trust Fund Office recently distributed the Fiscal Year End 2024 Annuity Statements, reporting a strong net investment return of approximately **15.4% as of July 31, 2024**. Leaving money in your annuity account allows it to grow through compounding returns, helping to maximize your retirement savings. Early withdrawals not only reduce future earnings but may also result in taxes and penalties. While Local 675 offers generous retirement benefits, it's essential to plan ahead and supplement your annuity with additional sources of retirement income to ensure that you have adequate savings for retirement.

under one roof has been a critical vision. With the new building, all Training needs will be in one place. The upgraded facility will feature dedicated classrooms and trade-specific work areas that will accommodate all the trades – Plumbing, A/C and Refrigeration, Fire Sprinkler Systems, and Welding, ensuring our members have access to the highest-quality hands-on education and instruction all in one location.

The lease for the current Training location in Iwilei will expire in mid-2026. Training will be first to relocate to the new building in 2026. Once they are settled, the Union Office and Trust Fund Administration Office will follow.

Training Highlights

'Pipeline to the Plumbers Union' Program expands to Maui Island

The 'Pipeline to the Plumbers Union' program was held for the first time on Maui from June 2nd through June 6th for eight high school seniors. The inaugural 'Maui Pipeline' provided students on Maui with the opportunity to participate in the hands-on training initiative and potentially serve as a stepping stone into the Union. The students were selected from four different high schools across the island by their high school teachers based on their performance and their interest in the building trades.

"Each of the eight students came from one of Maui's four district high schools, marking our presence and outreach on the island," said **Westin Alcover**, Assistant Training Coordinator. The eight students represented Baldwin High School (Wailuku), Maui High School (Kahului), Lahainaluna High School (Lahaina), and

King Kekaulike High School (Kula).

During the week-long program, students explored each trade through hands-on training in Plumbing, A/C and Refrigeration, Fire Sprinkler Systems, and Welding, while also earning CPR and First Aid certifications. Business Manager **Val Ceria** and Business Agents **Matt Brady**, **Sam Barrett Jr.**, **Benji Panis**, and **Sheung Man Wong** volunteered their time to share their experiences and mentor students throughout the program.

A graduation ceremony capped off the program, where families celebrated the students' hard work. "This was a great first run," said Business Agent **Benji Panis**. "It gave Maui students real exposure to Union opportunities—and to our contractors."

The Pipeline to the Plumbers Union program is a relatively new initiative. It was held for the second time on Oahu in March. Although it is a new program, its impact on these students, our community, and the opportunity it offers as a pathway into our Union is invaluable.

"Positive responses from teachers, parents, and the students themselves give us confidence that the word will spread, and this will increase awareness of the opportunities that our Union provides," said **Westin Alcover**.
